## MATCH REPORTS

### UNDER 15's - MANDURAH 26 def PERTH 19

It was pretty obvious from the start that this match was not going to be easy for Perth. Mandurah were a well drilled side with hard running backs and mobile forwards. They played a very good kicking game that exposed a lack of fitness amongst some of our team. We had difficulties getting to the breakdown; with the resultant lack of ball to our backs upsetting our structure. The first half was a dour struggle, Perth constantly repelling opposition attacks, many getting close to the try line. One Mandurah try was held up after some last ditch defence by Perth. Mandurah eventually succeeded late in the half with a well executed try.

Mandurah came out hard in the second half and caught our boys napping with a second try and a conversion. However, full credit to Perth as they quickly rallied to put over three unanswered tries via Hemi Chase, Tahī Broughton and Alex Preston (two conversions from Jackson Condren). A fine effort as the game looked to be slipping away from Perth at that stage. Mandurah were not to be denied, however, and scored another two tries, running out deserved winners on the day.

Perth players should not be down hearted with our first loss. They played with great spirit and tenacity in defence; and when the backs did get their hands on the ball, they opened up holes in the Mandurah defence on many occasions. The match result should probably be viewed more as a reality check, realising that we need to also work on our fitness at home, not just at training. We are improving as a team, one that has many new faces from last season, and supporting and learning from each other will provide a good platform for the rest of the year.
