A soggy ground made for difficult handling, the ball at times proving quite slippery, but the boys showed good signs that the training is starting to pay off. Strong efforts at the breakdowns and precise passes to the backs resulted in four tries in the first half. Perth dominated throughout the half and, but for a tendency for players to hang on to the ball for too long, we probably should have had a few more tries.
