## First Grade

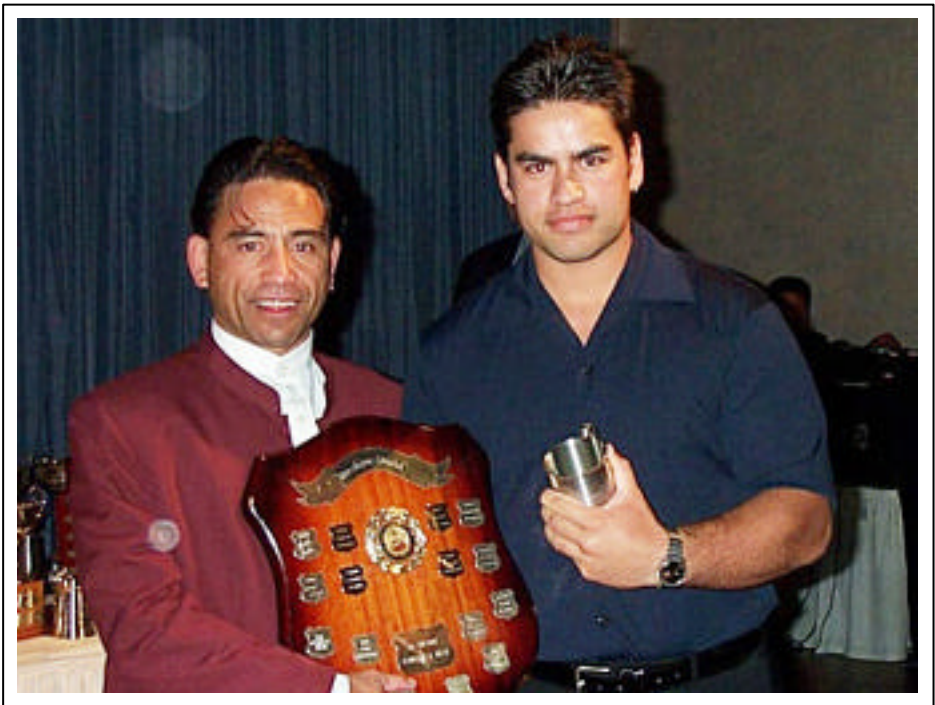
